FLIGHT ACADEMY

Calling all future pilots! As a Mad Science flight cadet, you will take a nosedive into the world of aerodynamics. Build your own kite, test stunt planes, and watch as we launch model rockets over 200 feet into the air! Then, set your eyes to the distant skies, and learn about outer space. Take a tour of the galaxies and learn more about the incredible place where we live: the Milky Way!

Daily topics listed below, which may not be taught in this order

The Wright Stuff

Step into the shoes of early aircraft inventors and experience the discovery of flight. Learn how the Wright brothers used science to achieve flight. Assemble your own rubber band powered stunt plane, and take home a flying helicopter that is similar to the toy that fascinated the Wright brothers as young boys!

Up, Up, and Away!

Harnessing the wind and taking flight is tons of fun! Build and decorate a kite while learning about the forces of flight. Utilize the power of the sun to discover how hot air balloons fly!

Milky Way

What is the Milky Way, and how do we know what's up there? Build your own sextant, sundial, planisphere and even a refracting telescope while discovering the wonders of the galaxy.

Rockin' Rockets

Imagine yourself soaring over the clouds and into space as you build your own model rocket that can fly over 200 feet! See the ins and outs of rockets with hands-on experiments and activities. Learn the Rocket Safety Code and take part in a real model rocket launch!

Newton's Loco-motion

Sir Isaac Newton was just as curious about how things move as we are. Discover Newton's Laws of Motion and something he called "inertia." Take part in a soda bottle rocket launch, and measure how high a model rocket can fly using a homemade altitude tracker!



UNDERGROUND EXPLORERS

Dinosaurs and Ancient Worlds

Dig up dinosaurs and the ancient past! Use evidence to solve real-life mysteries! Learn about archaeology and the techniques scientists use to excavate fossils and long-lost cities. Study bone fragments, pottery shards, and amber deposits to understand what they can tell us about history. What's more, each class includes a make and take-home project, like a fossil reproduction, an amber time capsule, and coins from around the world!

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History Hunters

Put on your paleontology hats and go looking for historical treasure! See the ins-and-outs of a paleontological dig. Learn about the different ways fossils are displayed by creating your own models!

Can You Dig It?

What could this bone belong to? Use your observational skills to piece together the puzzle and identify mystery bones, teeth, claws, and skulls! Excavate real animal bones from a pellet, and use everyday ingredients to create your own fossilization scene!

Pieces of our Past

Learn about patterns of wear, and hypothesize about the use and age of unfamiliar items. Decorate your own clay pot like an ancient artisan, and use patterns to piece together a damaged artifact!

Buried Stories

Learn about Pompeii and recreate the eruption of Mount Vesuvius. See how ancient civilizations were built, and simulate primordial aqueducts. Discover how certain conditions can preserve objects and help us better understand ancient cultures and historical events!

Ancient Artifacts

Discover how to date objects using techniques like carbon dating and stratigraphy. Use a metal detector to find hidden coins, and then use the skills you've learned to restore them to their former glory, and figure out where they came from!



Science in MOTION

Discover how things move with science! Each day, learn about a different realm of the scientific world. Become a zoologist and study the lives of birds! Step into the shoes of an engineer to learn all about structures & simple machines. Put on your lab coat and be a chemist for the day! What's more, you'll get to make and bring home animal houses, challenging puzzles, chemistry based creations, and more! Science in Motion is the perfect introduction to all things scientific!

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Jr. Engineers Structures are all around you, everywhere you look and everywhere you go! Join a team of scientists to inspect the elements of structures as you build and test structures. Climb inside a geodesic dome that you construct with fellow campers. 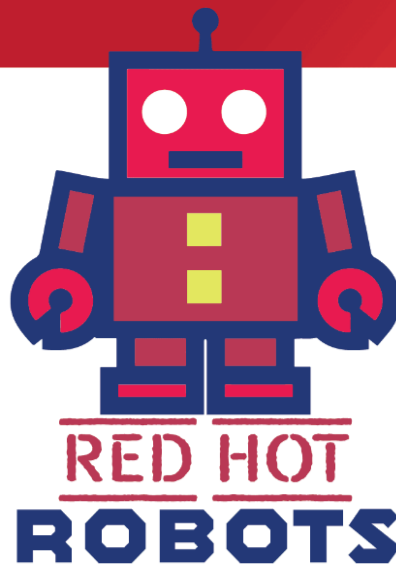
